

# Camp Sionito Rules

The following rules shall apply to all groups using the grounds and facilities at Sionito.

1. The Campground Manager shall be provided opportunity to present instructions, fire regulations, procedures for check-in and check-out, policies for the use of the grounds and other pertinent camp procedures and policies. This shall be done at the first general meeting held by the group using the campgrounds.
2. It is the responsibility of the Camp Director to assure compliance with the licensing rules for children's and youth camps known as the Texas Youth Camp Safety and Health Act. For further information contact Texas Department of Health, Austin, Texas.
3. The personal use of Fire arms, other weapons, fireworks or articles of incendiary nature are absolutely prohibited.
4. No hunting.
5. Alcoholic beverages, illicit drugs and smoking are prohibited.
6. Animals and pets, including but not limited to dogs, cats and horses are prohibited.
7. It is prohibited to carry persons in open vehicles other than in a passenger compartment. This rule bans the riding in the back of any open vehicle be it private or owned by the grounds. This applies to any vehicle on the grounds as well as to those transporting people to and from activities off the grounds.
8. Motor cycles and other motorized vehicles like these are prohibited for use on the grounds. ATV's and golf carts are limited to use by those handicapped and for medical reason.
9. Motor vehicles such as those bringing people onto the grounds are to remain in designated areas during the course of the activity.
10. For aquatics activities (swimming pool, river) see separate policy.
11. Papers and trash are to be deposited in trash containers.
12. The campground tools and equipment will only be used by permission of the caretaker and then returned promptly to their proper place.
13. The caretaker's quarters and personal property is private property and not to be used by campers.

14. All camp-owned vehicles are not to be used by anybody except when authorized by the caretaker.

15. Report all requests for repairs to the Program Director(s) and they will contact the caretaker.

16. No person or group will be allowed to leave or store on the grounds, personal property, or other items, in their charge.

17. Telephones, A pay phone is available. Only collect calls and calls charged to the home phone are permitted on the campgrounds phone. Any unauthorized phone calls will be billed to the activity responsible. Any use of the camp manager's computer must be authorized by the camp manager. This use must be limited to the either the camp director or camp business manager.

18. Public address system. This equipment is available for use by qualified personnel at the request of the Camp Director with the permission and under the direction of the caretaker.

19. Campfires/fires. Permanent campfire sites have been selected. Each site is stocked with material for building the fires and only this material may be used. All trees and bushes are to be left undisturbed. Never leave campfires unattended, or build fires in any location except the designated sites. No open fires are permitted for cooking except in designated areas with approval of the caretaker.

20. RV parking. These are available sites with water and electric hook-ups and sewage. Each Camp Director is responsible for assigning sites and controlling the parking of recreational vehicles in these sites.
